Advent is a season of hope and joy as we prepare for the birth of Jesus Christ and his second coming. This Advent is especially hopeful and joyful as Pope Francis will start the 2025 Jubilee on December 29 with the theme of "Pilgrims of Hope." Check back each week for a reflection that connects back to the Gospel reading.

### Advent Week 1 Scripture: Wake up

Read the Scripture passage below, followed by a reading from Pope Francis, then open Reflection questions and prayer.

From the holy Gospel according to Luke (Luke 21:34-36):

Jesus said to his disciples: "There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on earth nations will be in dismay, perplexed by the roaring of the sea and the waves.

People will die of fright in anticipation of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken.

And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.
But when these signs begin to happen, stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand.

"Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life, and that day catch you by surprise like a trap.

For that day will assault everyone who lives on the face of the earth.

Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man."

# Reading from *Spes Non Confundit*, for the Jubilee 2025

Pope Francis writes: "In the heart of each person, hope dwells as the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring.

Even so, uncertainty about the future may at times give rise to conflicting feelings, ranging from confident trust to apprehensiveness, from serenity to anxiety, from firm conviction to hesitation and doubt.

Often we come across people who are discouraged, pessimistic and cynical about the future, as if nothing could possibly bring them happiness. For all of us, may the Jubilee be an opportunity to be renewed in hope."

- What are the "anxieties of daily life" that can make my heart drowsy?
- How do I stay awake and vigilant?
- What is my attitude about the future?
- How do I need to be "renewed in hope" in the coming year?
- Are we a hopeful people—a hopeful Church?
- What are the reasons for our hope?



Hello everyone, Archbishop Etienne here.

As we prepare for the season of Advent, I am mindful of the birth of Jesus. Advent is a preparation for Christmas, and that incarnation of Jesus is God's journey to earth, to be with us through His son. Our Advent season recalls that, and that is the source of our hope and our rejoicing in this great love of God.

But Advent and indeed the whole faith journey is about our journey to God. And I propose that as a reflection, as we think about how can we make the best use of this Advent season. So, keep the kingdom of God in mind, and especially in prayer, and remind ourselves that this earth, this world is the place of our journey, but it's transitional. We are created for eternity. We are created for this lifelong eternal being with God, and we are learning how to live in that presence of God in this life.

And Advent, I think, is one of the best seasons of our whole liturgical life, to dwell on that truth and that reality. There is a passage in Psalm 1:24 that says, our help is in the name of the Lord who made heaven and earth. And we know it's not easy to live our faith to make this journey back to God, but the God who made all of this is our source of strength, and that gives me hope. And I spend quite a bit of my prayer and time dwelling on that truth to be able to do the things that God asks me to do.

So, this Advent season, know of my prayers for you. Let's journey together and let's ask the Lord to grant us the graces we're most in need of.



### **OUR IMPACT**



Served 109,109 of the most vulnerable people in our region thanks to the dedication of 4,070 staff members and 2,816 volunteers.



Twelve Regional Family Centers offered **43,260** people access to diverse programs, including outreach and walk-in services; transitional and permanent housing; medical, mental health, and substance use disorder treatment; and case management and volunteer services.



Our Long Term Care System provided **5,784** individuals with **2,045,392** hours of home care, including help with walking or mobility, bathing, foot care, transferring, chores, meal preparation, and nurse-delegated care.



Transportation, senior nutrition, and home care programs helped **22,312** individuals maintain their independence.




